"THE GRAND ARMY OF THE REPUBLIC (GAR)"

presented by Richard A. Davis, Ph.D. Wednesday, November 16, 2016 at 7:30 PM in the Phillippi Meeting Room, the Campus Center at the Otterbein Retirement Community, 585 State Rte. 741 (north of Rte. 63), Lebanon.

Richard A. Davis, Ph. D. will be giving a presentation on "The Grand Army of Republic (GAR)." The GAR began on April 6, 1866 in Decatur, Illinois. Veterans from the Army, Navy and Marine Corp were eligible for membership. At its peak, in 1890, there were more than 400,000 members. With numbers like that, the GAR was a most powerful political and social force in the Country. The GAR provided Retirement Homes and financial assistance to disabled and destitute veterans. The final member of the GAR died at the age of 109 and the organization ceased operation in 1956. It was also responsible for making "Memorial Day" a national holiday.

Dr. Davis, a geologist and paleontologist by training, served on the faculty of what is now Mount St. Joseph University in Cincinnati for some two decades, where he holds the rank of Professor Emeritus. Prior to that, he was curator at the Cincinnati Museum of Natural History. Dr. Davis is Past Commander of the General William H. Lytle Camp of the Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War and is the officer in charge of records of the Grand Army of the Republic for the State organization of the Sons.

WARREN COUNTY, OHIO VIRTUAL CEMETERY PROJECT – SEP. & OCT. ADDITIONS

In September & October a total of 712 photos have been added to our Virtual Cemetery Project for the following cemeteries.

- <u>Deerfield Cemetery</u> added photos for 133 burials. Now have photos on line for 3,417 of the 4,021 known burials
- <u>Jack Cemetery</u> added commentary by <u>Mary (Jack) Conklin</u> with results of Y DNA testing by descendants of Patrick Jack and James Jack.
- Mounts Cemetery added photos of 8 fieldstones and 15 gravestones dating from 1847 to 1872 from cemetery restoration by David Ehling & Bob Hackman. Dave has also erected a memorial marker at the Mounts Cemetery for Revolutionary War veteran, William Mounts.
- New Hope Cemetery added photos for 33 gravestones from Jacob Fry's Eagle Scout Project including 2 stones not previously photographed that were submitted by <u>Terry Easton</u>. Now have photos on line for 78 of the 83 known burials in this cemetery
- Rose Hill Cemetery Continued work on Section B5 having added photos for 255 burials. Now have photos on line for 6,703 of the 10,338 known burials.
- Woodhill Cemetery photos on line for 5,514 of the 12,814 known burials.
 - o updated 1,641 entries in our database for burials between 1995 and 2016.
 - o added photos for 3 burials in Jonathan White's lot 29 in Section 9
 - Finished adding photos for 776 burials in Section 5 taken by Corrick Magley for his Eagle Scout Project.

With these additions, our Virtual Cemetery Project has photos on line for 63,992 burials in 95 cemeteries.

Collins' mother (**Laura Shurts Collins**) has reason to believe that the following is a true record of birth of one Clyde C. Collins

=> **Dr. James Leonard Mounts** (1831-1909)

WCGS member <u>David Ehling</u> has donated transcription copies of 87 letters written by the doctor during the Civil War along with a copy of his Civil War Pension file. The following was extracted from his pension file.

James Leonard Mounts Invalid Pension File Application #649,842, Certificate #435932 (14 pages)

James L. Mounts enlisted Sept. 15th 1861 as Assistant Surgeon and was mustered into the 31st Ohio Infantry Regiment (3-year service) commanded by Colonel **Moses B. Walker** on Sept. 27, 1861.

On July 20, 1862, Dr. Mount was left in charge of about 75 sick from the 31st OVI at Tuscumbia Alabama instructions to bring them to Huntsville as soon as they were able to travel.

On August 12th, 1862, he was on a train of flat or box cars with convalescents, on the Memphis & Charleston Railroad four miles east of Tuscumbia going to Decatur or Huntsville Ala. The locomotive and two or three first flat cars ran off the track. **Dr. Mounts** was on a flat car loaded with camp equipage and an ambulance, the sudden stopping of the front of the train ran the ambulance on to him and he jumped off just as the car was about to upset, resulting in the injury to the right knee joint. He was taken back to Tuscumbia, to a private house where he remained about two weeks, got on crutches and attempted to join his command, but rail communication was cut off at Decatur. He returned to Tuscumbia, thence to Corinth. Expecting a battle there, was advised to get away and went home remaining on crutches about two months. Was never in any Hospital during the time except to stay a day or night. Consulted **Dr. S. U. Smith** Surgeon Genl of Ohio also **Dr. Judkins** in Cincinnati and **Dr. J. T. Cowden** at his home in Morrow. O. He returned to the 31st OVI on the day of the Battle of Perryville, Oct. 8, 1862. On account of his knee injury, he resigned his commission following the Battle of Stones River on 11 Jan 1863 at Murfreesboro, Tennessee.

On May 2, 1864, Dr. Mount reenlisted as a 34-year-old Surgeon in the 144th Ohio Infantry (100-day service) and was mustered out at Camp Dennison on Aug. 31, 1864. After leaving the service, he returned to Morrow Ohio and resumed his practice as a physician & surgeon.

On April 7, 1888, James L. Mounts, of Morrow, Ohio, appeared before the Clerk of Court in Warren County to make a declaration for an invalid pension based on his service in the 31st and 146th OVI. He was described as being 56 years old, 5 ft. 10 in., dark complexion, dark hair and grey eyes.

On June 4, 1898, he completed a circular stating that he was married to **Martha W. Smith** on December 1, 1859 by **Joseph M. Gatch** at Morrow Ohio. He listed their children as **Flora Mounts** born February 13, 1861, **Louis F. Mounts** September 23, 1865, **James Leonard Mounts** June 8, 1868 and **Grace E. Mounts**, January 18, 1876.

On Marth 11th, 1907, **James L. Mounts**, aged 75 of Morrow, Ohio, appeared before **William McDonald**, a Notary Public, for the purpose of making a declaration for an invalid pension under the Pension Act of 1907. He indicated that he was born August 19th, 1831 near Morrow in Hamilton Township and was a physician living in Morrow. His affidavit was witnessed by **Harley H. Dunn** and **Alice Hughes**.

Testimony in support of his 1888 application was provided by **Col. Moses B. Walker**, aged 68, of Kenton, Hardin County, Ohio; **Sargent Major Henry S. Byers**, aged 46, of Shelbyville, Indiana; **Dr. J. L. Williams**, aged 68, of Holton, Jackson County, Kansas; **Major John W. Free**, aged 57 of New Lexington, Perry County, Ohio; **Edward F. Fuller**, aged 64, of Morrow, **Edward R. Grim**, aged 49 of Morrow and **Ezekiel W. Woodward**, aged 59 of Morrow.

The papers in the pension file do not indicate when he was first awarded a pension. He was last paid \$20 to Sept. 4, 1909 and dropped from the rolls on Feb. 11, 1910 because of his death on Oct. 20, 1909.

ELIAS HORNER APPLICATION FOR NATURALIZATION, SEPTEMBER TERM 1832

Warren Common Pleas, Ex. parte **Elias Horner**, September Term A. D. 1832, Declaration for Naturalization Warren County to wit:

On this day personally appeared in open court, **Elias Horner**, an applicant for naturalization, who on being duly sworn declareth and Saith, that he is now thirty four years of age, that he was born in the County of York in England from whence in the month of September 1821 he emigrated to the United States of America, where he now resides, to wit in the County of Warren in the State of Ohio. And the said Elias further declareth and saith on his oath aforesaid, that it is bona fide his intention to become a citizen of the United States, and to renounce forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, State or Sovereignty whatever; and particularly to his Majesty William the Fourth, King of Great Britain Ireland &c. to whom he was heretofore a subject and further saith not.

Sworn to and subscribed in Open Court this 1st day of Oct. A.D. 1832 Elias Horner {signature}

This 34-page book provides the names 1,096 plaintiffs and defendants for 584 cases located in eight volumes, listing them by volume and page. An every name index is located at the back of the book.
