THINGS I LEARNED!

"No Soldier Left Behind: Military Repatriation" was the virtual program presented by Dana Palmer on Wednesday, August 21, 2024. The topic interested me, and I thought I had a decent understanding about what work she was doing on this, but I learned so much more during her presentation!

Dana explained, "Repatriation is the process of bringing home the body of a service person who has died." Through DNA work and genealogy, efforts are made to identify the remains and then identify and locate the next of kin. Once they are identified and contacted, if applicable, arrangements are then made for bringing the Soldier's remains home and the funeral and interment.

But did you know the numbers involved here? On the Defense POW / MIA Accounting Agency's website, the number given for Total Missing is 84.609. This includes those missing from WWII, the Korean War, the Cold War, and the Gulf War and other conflicts. Of these, 3,399 have been accounted for and 81,210 unaccounted for. Since this only reflects numbers associated to their mission since 1973, the actual number of Americans missing is much higher. This hit home with me because one of the 41,000 missing that are presumed lost at sea is my Great Uncle Donald Sundin, brother to Bob Sundin, who was a longtime resident of Mason, Ohio.

"On February 5, 1943, Signalman 3rd Class Donald E. Sundin, a U.S. Navy Armed Guard, was on board S.S. West Portal, an American merchant ship, as it made its way from New York and Halifax to Liverpool. The freighter, carrying general cargo, army stores, and mail, had straggled from Convoy SC-118 and was sailing a zigzag course when it was spotted by German submarine U-413. From a distance of 3500 yards, the U-boat fired a spread of four torpedoes, the third hitting the ship forward of the bridge. Two more torpedoes were fired and the second hit the stern, causing the ship to sink. Although some of the men were observed by the Germans getting into lifeboats, they were never seen again. A distress signal was received by HMS Vanessa (D29), but no position was given. HMS Vanessa left the convoy and searched but nothing was found. There were 40 Merchant Mariners, 25 Navy Armed Guards, and 12 Passengers on board; none survived." This information was provided by Patricia O'Neal.

Through Dana's presentation, I learned there are recovered remains being catalogued and DNA tested, but with no way to identify them unless a family member supplies their DNA so it can potentially be matched. The DNA must be tested through the Armed Forces DNA Identification Laboratory (AFDIL) located in Dover Air Force Base in Delaware. These DNA kits are not used for any other purpose other than to assist with the identification of remains. DNA tests done at commercial sites such as Ancestry.com and FamilyTreeDNA.com cannot be used for repatriation testing.

If you have a family member who was either Killed in Action (KIA) or Missing in Action (MIA) and served in the Army, more information about how you can help can be found on the United Stated Army Human Resources Command website. There is a place to search the unaccounted-for list, a chart to determine if you would be a qualified potential DNA donor, and contact information for the Past Conflict Repatriations Branch.

Once you are logged in, select "Browse Newspapers by State" from the top menu bar and enter "Lebanon" in the Filter by City box. Your search will bring up what they have available:


There is a new layout for their event (see map below).
