Patricia Ann Perkins, age 81 of Lebanon, Ohio, passed away at Bethesda North Hospital on Friday, July 19, 2024, after a brief illness. Patricia was born in Cincinnati, Ohio on June 29, 1943, the daughter of George and Antonette (nee Sacco) Gill. 

# **SUPPORT THE STAR!**

Our fundraising campaign to <u>Support the Star!</u> was launched July 4, 2024, with a goal of raising **\$20,000** by July 4, 2025. If you enjoy having the *Western Star* newspaper online, will you consider helping us finish this monumental digitization project?



Since the fall of 2018, the <u>Alleen Stephenson Digital Newspaper Project</u> has provided <u>FREE</u> online public access to digital images of the Lebanon Western Star from 1807 through 1988 on the Ohio Memory Project. These digital images were created from original copies of the newspaper located at the Ohio History Center in Columbus and from microfilm provided by the Warren County Historical Society and Warren County Genealogical Society.

The <u>Alleen Stephenson Digital Newspaper Project</u> is sponsored and maintained by the Warren County Genealogical Society. Using digitization and OCR technology, it provides <u>FREE</u> public access to <u>over 136,000 pages</u> of this historical newspaper. There are some issues missing, but the entire collection on hand is browsable and searchable by titles, names, or dates.

This project is dedicated to the remarkable Alleen Stephenson and was made possible through the generosity of Alleen's son and daughter-in-law, J. Todd and Rebecca Stephenson. For more than 60 years, Alleen wrote a much-loved column about the Kings Mills community that celebrated and preserved many aspects of the County's history.

Published for 206 years from 1807 to 2013, the *Western Star* is Ohio's oldest weekly newspaper. This newspaper reported the local news and activities of the citizens of Lebanon, Warren County, and nearby areas. The first publisher was John McLean (1785-1861), who was an American attorney, a political activist who served in the United States Congress, and a justice of the Ohio and the U.S. Supreme Courts. He started his legal career in Cincinnati and moved to Lebanon, Ohio, to open a law practice and dedicate his time to opening and running a weekly newspaper.

### ORAL HISTORY: A HOW-TO GUIDE STRAIGHT FROM THE ARCHIVES

According to Wikipedia.org, oral history is "the collection and study of historical information about people, families, important events, or everyday life using audiotapes, videotapes, or transcriptions of planned interviews. These interviews are conducted with people who participated in or observed past events and whose memories and perceptions of these are to be preserved as an aural record for future generations. Oral history strives to obtain information from different perspectives and most of these cannot be found in written sources. Oral history also refers to information gathered in this manner and to a written work (published or unpublished) based on such data, often preserved in archives and large libraries."

For genealogists, oral histories can be invaluable in providing details you would never find in most historical records, while giving you a sense of the person relating the information in a way that allows you to have an actual memory of them. You will recall the words they used, the tone of their voice, and the cadence of their speech. If this person was a beloved family member or friend, it becomes a way to keep a part of them with you and their memory alive after they have passed.

While generations before us used oral history to pass down information about the family, it became less commonplace to do this as the way we lived changed. Grandparents, and even great-grandparents were once part of our families living in our homes and gave us the chance to hear stories and ask questions. Many of us have lost that, but hope prevails!
